ANNOUNCER: (V.O.):

The aristocrat among ducks is the canvasback, named after the drake's white back. They can be distinguished by their sloping foreheads and long bills.

[Canvasback ducks swimming]

The hen's slate-brown colouring is more subdued than the striking plumage of her mate.

The canvasback breeds on small, permanent marshes, but rarely along large stretches of open water.

[Canvasback duck swimming]

Once a common bird, the canvasback is now growing scarce. It is a hardy duck, which arrives very early in spring, nests in the parklands of Western Canada, and returns south when the waters of the north become frozen.

[Canvasback duck flying]
