The mallard duck has managed to exist in man's world, and he's done it most successfully. Mallard's are the most abundant species of waterfowl in North America, and breed primarily in the small water areas of the grasslands and parklands of Western Canada.

The female nests in a variety of locations, but most likely under bushes or in high grass, reasonably close to water. Mallards lay 12 to 18 eggs, but usually only about six young survive.
