In the frigid arctic waters of Northern Canada is a thriving ecosystem, home to one of the world's most mysterious creatures, the narwhal.

Narwhals can hold their breath for up to 20 minutes while feeding under the arctic ice. They can dive over a kilometre deep, and they use echolocation to hunt for fish and squid, often while swimming upside down.

[Different narwhals diving]

One of the narwhal's best known features is its tusk, which is really an ivory tooth that grows up to 3 metres long on males.

Narwhals are social animals, often travelling in pods of three to eight individuals, though herds of hundreds are seen on occasion.

Today, researchers continue to unravel the many secrets of the narwhal and its Arctic Ocean habitat. And that's just a start.
