## The Snow Goose - 60-Second - Captioned for the Visually Impaired

MUSIC: "HINTERLAND WHO'S WHO" THEME

ANNOUNCER: (V.O.):

The greater snow goose is one of three kinds of white goose in North America, and is distinguished by its 1 and 1.5 metre wingspan and black wingtips.

[Snow gooses flying and landing on water]

Their narrow, high bill has serrated edges, which enables them to feed on the roots of plants.

[Snow goose feeding on the ground]

In their remote arctic breeding grounds, the nest is protected during the incubation period by the gander. The goslings hatch in mid-July, and have until early September to prepare for their long southern migration.

[Snow goose family swimming together]

In 1900, there were only an estimated 3,000 birds, but today as a result of careful wildlife management, their numbers exceed 200,000.
