ANNOUNCER: (V.O.):

The wolverine is one of Canada's most solitary animals. Because a wolverine's territory can cover more than 1,500 square kilometres, very few people have seen one in the wild. Experts still have much to learn about the behaviour and habitat.

Wolverines will defend their food from animals much larger than themselves, including bears. They can hunt, but survive mainly on the kills of other predators, such as wolves.

Because of this, human efforts in the past to control wolf populations impacted the wolverine's food source. These effects are still felt today.

Human development, habitat loss, and the overhunting of caribou also threaten their survival. Today, wolverines are endangered in Eastern Canada, but some populations in Western Canada also face challenges.

Together, we need to help this iconic animal survive. And that's just a start.
